# Implementing a Curriculum on Disaster Behavioral Health in a Psychiatry Residency Program

#### **Background**

This current era of superimposed disasters, extreme events, humanitarian crises, and pandemic diseases is an opportune time to train psychiatry residents to become knowledgeable about disaster behavioral health (DBH) principles and skilled in applying DBH interventions.

### Methods

A voluntary and anonymous electronic survey was distributed to psychiatry residents to assess interest in a disaster behavioral health course and to assess their current disaster behavioral health related knowledge and skill levels.

Residents were asked to rate their confidence in current knowledge level on various disaster behavioral health principles and skills using a 5-point likert scale.


21 residents participated (40%) response rate)

- PGY1: 14.3%
- PGY2: 33.3%
- PGY3: 33.3%
- PGY4: 19.0%

## **Survey Results**

## Rate your Confidence in your Ability to Complete the Following Tasks Related to Disaster **Behavioral Health**

■ Not Confident At All ■ Only Slightly Confident ■ Somewhat Confident ■ Moderately Confident ■ Very Confident



Resident survey results demonstrated limited knowledge of disaster behavioral health principles, low levels of confidence in

skills to support the psychological needs of survivors, and strong interest in receiving training. 85.7% of participating residents indicated interested in attending classes on disaster behavioral health. So, we proceeded to develop a disaster behavioral health training curriculum for residents, starting with a lecture series featuring experts in the field.
